Before You Go



How does a surprise road trip work?



Pick a Date

We recommend doing the trip within **6 months** of receiving this road trip. Pay close attention to the 'When To Go' within the 'Navigating the Road' section of this booklet.



Get Ready

The only requirement is having a vehicle, GPS and a driver. The trip is completely **self-guided**, so nothing needs to be booked in advance.



Check Updates

Before leaving, please check **travel updates** on our website. This will provide you with any major changes to the itinerary.



Pack Your Bag

Please refer to the 'What to Pack' list in this booklet for items we recommend bringing with you.



Hit the Road!

Don't open the first envelope until you're ready to leave. Once you're finished at the first stop, you can open the second envelope. Four stops are included within your road trip.

Your day ahead! Without giving away too many details.

We often include a variety of recommendations at each stop. You do not have to go to all of them, pick and choose what works best for you and your travel mates. If you can't get through all of the stops during the day - come back and explore them at a later date!





Time to Depart!

We recommend departing **around 9 am if you're coming from Nanaimo**, and an hour earlier if you're coming from Victoria. This is a fantastic overnight getaway from Victoria too! The later you leave, the less time you'll have to explore all of the suggested stops.

- This itinerary can be done any day of the week between mid-March to December. For the best animal viewing, we recommend travelling between June -October.
- We do not recommend travelling between January - early March.

Frequently Asked Questions

How much will the stops cost?

First Stop: One option requires an entrance fee per person (\$). We provide two free alternatives.

Second Stop: No fee.

Third Stop: No fee.

Fourth Stop: No fee.

*Please note: gas, tolls, and food may be additional costs.

When should we leave?

We recommend departing around 9 am if you're coming from Nanaimo, and an hour earlier if you're coming from Victoria. This is a fantastic overnight getaway from Victoria too! The later you leave, the less time you'll have to explore all of the suggested stops.

Can I bring my dog?

This trip is **somewhat dog friendly!**There is at least one dog friendly option on every stop; however, most options are outdoor suggestions, so please keep in mind the weather.
Some of our eat/drink suggestions offer dog friendly patios.

Hiking safety & what to pack:

There are a few trails on this trip that lie within bear country. Should you choose to visit these spots, we recommend packing the "eleven essentials for hiking" when venturing into the wilderness:

• Bear spray, flashlight/headlamp with extra batteries, signaling device, fire starter, warm clothes, pocketknife, shelter (large plastic bag or tarp), water & snacks, first aid kit, navigation (map/GPS), and communications/cellphone.

How long will the total trip take?

See the approximate round-trip driving distances/times below. These are driving distances only and do not factor in time spent at stops.

From Nanaimo:

2 hours and 45 minutes / 188 km

From **Duncan**:

3 hours and 55 minutes / 287 km

From Victoria*:

5 hours and 40 minutes / 408 km

*We recommend making this into an overnight getaway if your drive time exceeds 4 hours round-trip.

How many people can I bring with me?

We recommended bringing up to 5 people on your surprise road trip.

If you're bringing a larger group, we highly recommend having one person in charge of booking reservations at restaurants and attractions in advance. Please see the previous page for a copy of the digital itinerary.

Is this wheelchair or stroller accessible?

First Stop: Two options are wheelchair accessible. One waterfall trail is not accessible.

Second Stop: There are multiple accessible options on this stop.

Third Stop: One waterfall trail is not accessible, but we provide an accessible woodland trail.


Fourth Stop: There are multiple accessible options at this stop.
